Shortly after arrival, the new resident is encouraged to select a hand-made quilt that is theirs to keep and pass to a family member or loved one, if they wish. The quilts are made with love and donated to Celia's House by local quilt makers.

Support Volunteers & Visiting



Volunteers visit daily, providing companionship, advocacy, and listening to residents' concerns.

Families and friends are welcome to visit in the resident's private room or hold gatherings in the main areas of the beautiful house and gardens. Puzzles and books are available in the library, as well as a cupboard of toys for children.

Meals

Our nurturing chefs and cooks tailor homemade meals to meet the resident's desires, tastes, and needs. Family meals are provided by the Acton Black Family Food Program, created by a grateful family in memory of their beloved father.

No One Dies Alone Program

We are proud to offer bedside companionship for residents who are alone at the end of life. This program also supports family and friends who are unable to be with their loved one as they near death.
